
In the story (movie) "Casablanca," people are




The people must have a means to defend themselves.

Money


It is abundantly clear that certain nations regard money as weapons; the United States, Russia, China to name a few. And others see they are merely pawns in this "war" game.

On page 160 of "Currency Wars" the author James Rickards writes: "The clearest exposition of Chinese thinking on financial warfare is an essay called 'The War God's Face Has Become Indistinct,' included in a book on unrestricted warfare written in 1999 by Colonels Qiao Liang and Wang Xiangsui of the People's Liberation Army. One passage in particular is worth quoting at length:

"Financial warfare has now officially come to war's center stage - a stage that for thousands of years has been occupied only by soldiers and weapons We believe that before long, "financial war-

"Consideration of such military doctrine suggests that the future of geopolitics might not be the benign multilateral ethos of Davos Man but rather more dark and dystopian world of resource scarcity, infrastructure collapse, mercantilism and default. China's call to replace the U.S. dollar as the global reserve currency, routinely dismissed by *bien-pensant* global elite, might be taken more seriously if they were as familiar with Chinese financial warfare strategy as with Keynesian theory."

The author of "Currency War" points out that the Chinese [PRC government] have direct telephone lines into the

mega banks [of New York City] UBS, J.P. Morgan, Goldman Sachs, other, for purposes of buying and selling U.S. treasuries, U.S. Government securities, mortgage backed securities, other. Are they buying and selling paper gold/silver, too?

The author of a recent article in "Aviation Week & Space Technology"/August 19, 2013 points out that while "General Keith Alexander, director of NSA, undertook a charm offensive with a keynote speech at the Black Hat hacker conference in Las Vegas last month, a smaller gathering of high-level information-security professionals in London were discussing a radical vision for how the NSA, the Internet and telecom industries could capitalize on recent leak of classified information." Further on the author writes: "What is lacking is an understanding of just how vulnerable one can be when it comes to digital information," says A.J. Clark, a former U.S. military data fusion analyst."

Off the shelf technology solutions exist, that allow people to defend themselves here, too.

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The Image and "Persona" of NSA Have Changed - cont.

Dr. Eric Berne writes in "The Structure and Dynamics of Organizations and Groups", page 113:

"The following hypotheses are offered:

1. The proceedings of any group are regulated by two authorities: the leadership and the group canon.
2. There are three kinds of leadership: the responsible leader, the effective leader and the psychological leader.
3. The members demand

certain absolute qualities of their leaders so that fundamentally every successful leader is a charismatic leader.

4. The culture of a group can be divided into three aspects: the technical culture, the group etiquette and the group character. The last two are based on an implicit contract that the members will respect each others' personas. Each group evolves its own standards of behavior, its

own ways of reinforcing the contract and its own ways of violating it in certain respects.

5. Each of the three aspects of a group culture is derived from a special aspect of the members' personalities: the technical culture from the realistic (adult) aspect; the group etiquette from the traditional (parental) aspect; and the group character from the emotional (archaic) aspect."

Trading Stamps

The following is from Eric Berne's book "Group Treatment", page 286

Trading Stamps

"Transactional trading stamps are the currency of what are colloquially known as "rackets," chiefly guilt, fear, hurt, and anger, and often inadequacy, stupidity, or bafflement as well. When the patient is young, his parents teach him how to feel when things get difficult: "In our family, when things get difficult, we feel guilty (afraid, hurt, angry, inadequate, baffled)." These feelings become rackets when the patient learns to exploit them and collect them in his games and script, usually because they have become sexualized. For example, much "justifiable" grown-up anger belongs in this category, the payoff in the game called "Now I've Got You, You Son of a Bitch." Here the patient's Child is full of suppressed anger. He waits until someone does something that justifies his expressing it. Justification means that his Adult goes along with his Child in saying to his Parent, "No one can reasonably blame me for getting angry under such conditions." Thus relieved of Paranoid censure, he turns on the offender and says, in effect, "Ha! No one would blame me, so 'Now I've Got You.'" etc. In transactional language, he gets a "free mad" (a "red trading stamp"). If he saves them up instead of cashing them in on the spot, he may eventually get enough to feel entitled to a "free" homicide.

A patient went home from a group meeting one day and briefly explained trading stamps to her 12-year-old son. He said, "Okay, mom, I'll be back soon." When he returned, he had a small roll of perforated stamps for which he had made a dispenser, and a little paper book with the pages divided into squares. The legend read: "This page when full of stamps entitles you to one free suffer." The boy understood perfectly the prin-

ple involved: if people do not spontaneously frighten you, provoke you, insult you, or entice you, then you can initiate a game in order to make them do it; in this way free fights, mads, suffers, or guilts can be collected.

The "store" where transactional stamps are redeemed has the same assortment of prizes as regular trading-stamp store: big ones, little ones, and toys. For "100 books," say, the patient can get one of the big ones: a free suicide, a free homicide, a free psychosis, or a free quit (divorce, leave therapy, quit job). For "10 books" he can get a toy (unsuccessful) suicide. For "1 book" he can get a "little" prize, a free sexual fantasy or drunk. An alcoholic, for example, by starting a game of "Uproar" at home, may provoke his wife into giving him 10 insult stamps, which entitle him to guilt-free evening at the corner saloon and a
